

Rock, Rhythm & Blues to Showcase Two Bands on November 26th

The Johnstown Free Medical Clinic will feature two bands at this year's Rock, Rhythm & Blues fundraiser to be held Wednesday, November 26th at 6 p.m. at Ace's, 316 Chestnut Street, in the Cambria City neighborhood of Johnstown. Live performances by local band, Black Cat Moan and Pittsburgh's Billy Price Band promise a high-energy event for all blues lovers.

Black Cat Moan is a regular performer at Cambria City's Venue of Merging Arts (VOMA) and was included in the line-up at the Flood City Music Festival this past summer. The group includes three members: George Byick on guitar; Zach Bodoloski on drums, and vocals by T.K. Mundok. The group is influenced by artist Robert Johnson and describes their music as "New Vintage Blues," a combination of blues, jazz, and rock.
