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Highlands Health Clinic CARES

Highlands Health Clinic is committed to serving our community. Last year over 2,500 individuals received medical, pharmaceutical and wellness care at the clinic. Of that number, 784 patients were evaluated, diagnosed, and provided a treatment plan. In addition, 69 patients received job physicals, 176 were provided Narcan and training, 107 were given



various immunizations, 132 received Vivitrol injections and 1,447 individuals received the COVID vaccine. The clinic dispensed in-house, over 1.1 million dollars in medication to our patients.

Clinic services were provided not only at the clinic but at churches, community events, public housing, schools, fairs, parks, senior citizens apartments and individual's homes. Since the beginning of the pandemic, HHC administered 15,000 COIVID vaccinations and traveled to the homes of 800 disabled, and vulnerable, homebound residents.

How Many Times Do You Help?

If you are in a boat and see the person next to you jump into the water acting reckless, or fall overboard, or get pushed, do you throw a life preserver. If they continue to act reckless and fall overboard again, do you throw the life preserver the second time or a third time. Of course, you do! An individual with substance use disorder deserves to have a life preserver thrown as many times as necessary. Recently a middle-aged woman with two grown children asked the clinic for help. She was clean for years and relapsed. Her family rejected her. She had no support, felt hopeless, lost her job, could not pay her bills, and faced eviction. She was so depressed she could hardly get out of bed. She was days away from being homeless. Fortunately, she came to the clinic to seek medical attention and we learned about her other issues. We threw the life preserver and helped her to find the funds to pay her back rent, encouraged her to interview for a job (she was hired), assisted her with making a budget and arranged support counseling. This is a success story, in fact, she in paying back the money given to stop her eviction.

Rich grew the company from one regional client with \$600K revenues in their opening year to 24 clients in six states, well over 55 full-time employees and contractors, and \$2.2 million in revenues. Other major contribution include developing a LEAN Six Sigma quality initiative, training over 120 management personnel, and coordinated efforts to improve operational efficiency post-merger of two organizations which resulted in a \$17.5 million-dollar reduction of operating expenses while preserving greater than 95% of the workforce.
